THE GOOD SHEPHERD

Sixth Sunday of Resurrection | Gospel Reading: John 9:39-10:10

Have you ever heard the story of the boy who cried wolf? It is about a little boy who was hired to keep watch over a flock of sheep. He got bored one day watching the sheep and decided to play a trick on his fellow villagers. He pretended that there was a wolf who was coming to eat the sheep, so he called out, "Wolf! Wolf!"

The villagers all came running to help him, but he just laughed at them. He did this again and again the villager dropped everything they were doing to come and save the sheep from the wolf, but he laughed again.

Then a wolf really did come to kill and eat the sheep. The little boy shouted, "Wolf! Wolf!" but nobody came to help. They all thought he was tricking them again and the little boy could only stand and watch the wolf eat the sheep he was put in charge of.

The little boy did not take his job as shepherd seriously because the sheep were not his, but he was hired to watch the sheep. Jesus, on the other hand, takes care of His sheep with His whole life because the sheep belong to Him. Who are the sheep of Jesus? We are!

Jesus is our shepherd and we are His sheep. He protects and defends us from the wolves that try to hurt us. He takes this very seriously and when He calls out to us, we recognize His voice and follow Him, like sheep do to their shepherd.

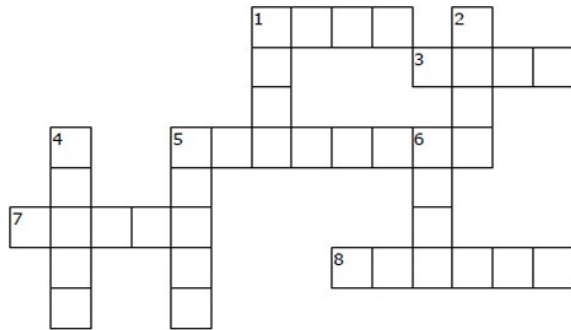

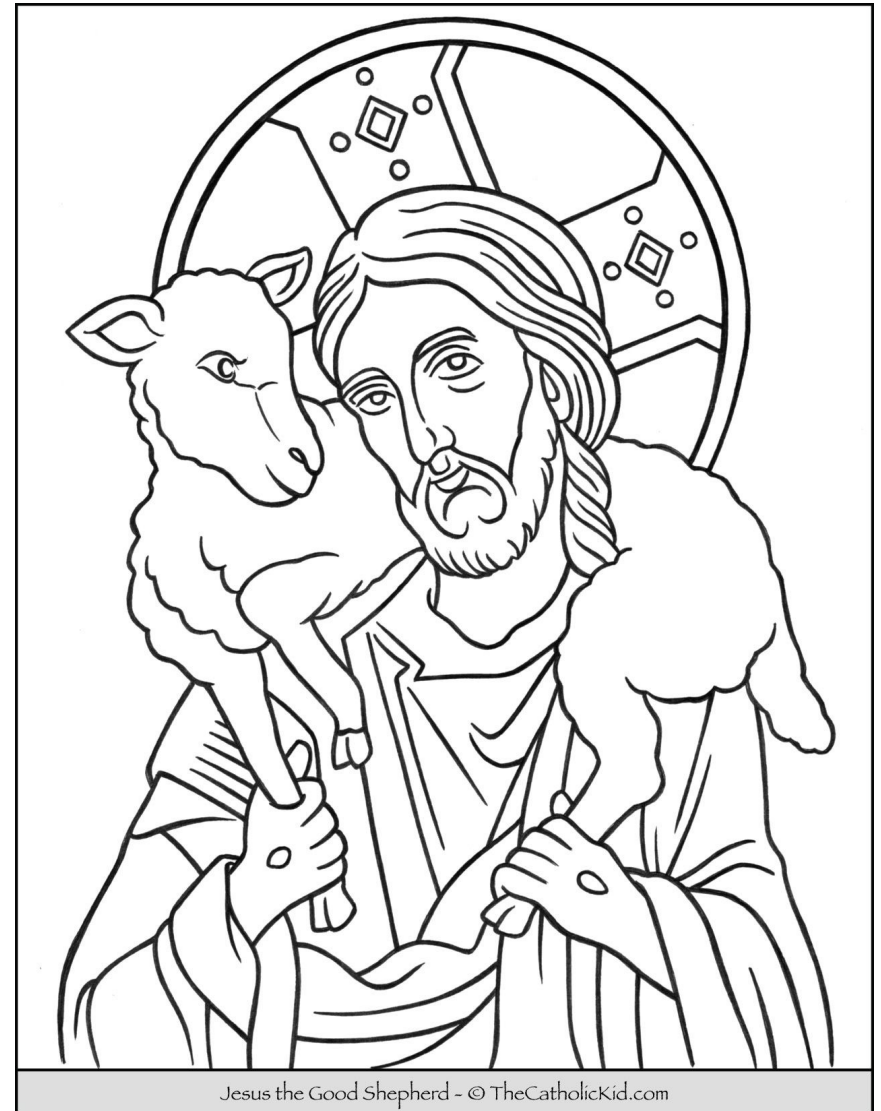
- A strong feeling of affection
