

SUNDAY OF THE JUDGE

The Sunday of the Judge, reminds us of the importance of prayer and of the virtues of humility, fear of God, justice and protection of the weak. The Parables of the Widow and the Judge, and the Pharisee and the Tax Collector illustrate the results of the proper practice and importance of persistent prayer with a humble heart. In the former parable, Christians, like the widow, should not give up praying to God even when facing indifference and powerful opposition. If a helpless widow wins her case by persistent pleading before a callous judge, how much will God's elect find quick justice before a loving and righteous Father?

After encouraging the disciples to be persistent in prayer, in the latter parable, Jesus teaches them how to pray. This parable sharply contrasts the prayer of a Pharisee with that of a tax collector. Jesus commended the tax collector for his humble, contrite and "justified" prayer to God and contrasted that with the hypocrisy of the Pharisee's sense of self-righteousness.

PERSISTENT PRAYER

Sunday of the Judge | Gospel Gospel Reading: Luke 17:20-18:14

We pray for many things and want those things to become a reality. We pray to God and ask Him to help our families, our friends, and in our lives. But sometimes those prayers are not answered immediately. What do we do when we don't have our prayers answered? What do you do?

For many people they stop praying. They give up and think God is not listening or does not love them. This is not true at all. God loves us and wants us to keep praying to Him. But why doesn't he answer when we want something? Sometimes God see that whatever we are asking for is not what we really need or we are not ready for it at that time.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus tells a story about a widow (someone whose husband died) going to a judge to demand justice. The judge ignored her and did not want to help her with her case. But she kept going and annoying him. Finally, the judge because he was tired of hearing the widow's requests, finally gave her justice.

Jesus explains that if the judge, who was not nice, finally answered the widow's requests, how much more so will God, who loves us, answer our requests.

We must always remember that prayer should not be a one-time act and once we pray, we do not need to pray anymore. Prayer to Christians is as necessary as breathing. Just as breathing keeps us alive, so too does prayer with our faith.

When you pray, do you pray only once or do you pray for the same thing over and over?

If you haven't received what you are praying for, could it be that God thinks you are not ready for it yet?
